Trudging towards Global Peace

"Nuclear proliferation — the proliferation of WMDs altogether — is one of the greatest dangers of our time."

Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMDs) have always been known to bring significant harm. The requisite to prevent the spread of these weapons has been apparent since the early days of the Manhattan Project. Even today, nuclear disarmament and non-proliferation are among the highest priorities on the international political agenda. But before these goals can be achieved

Iran's nuclear capabilities have been a hot topic for some time now. At present, Iran claims to not possess WMDs — a claim supported by the International Atomic Energy Agency. The state's policy is to use nuclear power as a peaceful means of generating energy. Further, Iran does have certain international obligations in terms with the Non-Proliferation Treaty. Yet, there are those who would argue for greater vigilance, even superseding that provided by the IAEA. With the danger of the acquisition of Weapons of Mass Destruction by terrorist groups rising — and the ramifications of such a brokerage being catastrophic — they would advise wariness of a State reputed for aiding the actions of extremists in the past.

It is now in the hands of the United Nations as a whole to carry out its function vigorously to prevent and combat such illicit trading activities, and curb any further WMD proliferation.

A Breach of Trust (& Data) -Seerat Ghai

okerage and analysis

Cambridge Analytica is British political consulting firm which combines data mining, brokerage and analysis with strategic communication to aid politicians in elections. Their CEO, Alexander Nix, has stated that the firm was involved in 44 US political races in 2014. In 2015, it performed data analysis for Ted Cruz's presidential run, and in 2016, led Donald Trump's team to victory. Further, it worked for the Leave campaign during Britain's referendum to withdraw from the EU. Its role in these campaigns has been controversial and is the subject of ongoing investigations on both sides of the Atlantic.

Recently, Cambridge Analytica's former employee Christopher Wylie turned whistleblower. He revealed that the company bought user data from an application called "This Is Your Digital Life", which Facebook allegedly encouraged its users to download. The data collected through this 'app' was allegedly shared with Cambridge Analytica. The data of almost 50 million people was collected for analysis, according to claims now under review by the European Court of Justice. This data ranged from preferences in online shopping, political opinions shared with friends, posts liked or shared privately — essentially, a gold mine for data analysts. That said, it could be devastating for a person's private life should it reach the wrong hands (if it should be in any hands at all).

The question now arises as to what penalty, if any, will be imposed on Facebook Inc. — a multi-billion dollar international conglomerate that had formerly promised to not release said data without the express consent of those to whom it belonged. It's time to wait and watch what happens.

I wipe off her tears and continued to cook. I ask you people who have minds with no open windows, is your tolerance and patience really so marginal? Is there really nothing that we can do? Nothing to stop abba from punishing ammi? Or to stop him from forcibly getting aapa married? Aapa is just 15. She still wants to study. But abba says that it's not right to let a girl study after she's 15. He says all the men outside have already started asking questions.

I wonder if that's the situation of other women in the city! I think there aren't many because if there were, wouldn't the knowledgeable and the educated stop it from happening? Wouldn't there be rules and regulations to stop people like abba from doing what they do? And if there are laws, why aren't they working? I wonder what would be if all women were as free and privileged as men. Or rather, I hope there comes a time when 'being privileged' is something you could be based on your education and not your gender. After all, we are not the ones who decide if we'll be a girl or a boy. Then why does it decide so many things for us.

Maybe the changing, developed and technologically-advanced world will be able to make a change. A change in the way you people with closed minds think. And if we aim to liberate women, we must do so in all ways possible and start doing so by opening and expanding the minds of these men.
