He decided to burn all his ships so that his troops could not withdraw from the British shores, no matter what happened and would either have to win or die fighting.

With the hope of returning to their ships gone, the Roman Soldiers fought relentlessly and won the battle in spite of the fact that they were pitted against superior forces. This ability to take prompt decisions was the key to Caesar's success and he won many battles because he could take important decisions quickly. Great men like Caesar and Napoleon cultivated the power to decide instantly which course of action to pursue. By taking prompt decisions, they inspired confidence, courage and trust in their soldiers.
